Appearing in Revolutionary War costume, Captain Paul Sanborn will present his talk in first person.

The Trust has been fortunate in engaging one of His Excellency, General George Washington, most valued officers. Captain Paul Sanborn was born in Wyndham, Colony of New Hampshire to god-fearing parents. Raised as a tavern keeper by his father, Sanborn has had extensive experience roaming the north woods as a militia officer. In 1775, Sanborn was alarmed as captain of his town's militia company to answer the British sortie at Lexington. Skilled in the affairs of partisan warfare, Sanborn is presently commanding a light infantry company of New Hampshire troops under the command of Colonel Francis Barber of the Jerseys. Shifting south into the Virginias to assist General LaFayette, Sanborn has agreed to stop by on his way south to make commentary on the present state of affairs in the war. We hope you will join us at Devon Prep School's Great Hall to hold open discourse with Captain Sanborn on matters of some import.

Paul J. Sanborn is the Information Specialist for Devon Preparatory School. In addition to handling library and research duties, Mr. Sanborn teaches AP European History and the Senior Seminar (Vietnam) in the classroom. He is the head coach of the school's Academic Challenge team, the men's cross country team, the indoor track team and spring track and field programs for Devon. Additional pursuits include directing the Freedoms Foundation Graduate History programs held each summer for educators from all over the United States.

He has been a successful educational guide to historic sites for many years, providing his first "professional" tour in 1963 through Valley Forge Park. Mr. Sanborn participated in his first "Living History" event as a Civil War drummer in 1961 and has been active in the field of living history reenactments ever since. He is the regimental surgeon/chaplain for the 2nd Pennsylvania Regiment of the Continental Line and is a surgeon with the Second Corps Hospital in Civil War events.

Mr. Sanborn earned his BA in Russian Studies from Villanova University. He received his first Master's degree from West Chester University in Philosophy (Corruption of Marxist Ideals in the Soviet Model). He earned an MBA from St. Joseph's University. From American Military University, Mr. Sanborn earned an MA in Land Warfare.
