- Welcome and introduction of guests

Updates

- Engineer's report, Dave: Strafford Library Permeable Pavement (lower parking lot) has been completed, awaiting permeable asphalt flood test before reopening; Bair Road infiltration improvement is completed; Upper Weadley (between Willis and Woodcrest) underground infiltration project has been approved by Supervisors; Gregory Lane, finalizing engineers report and utilities, is expected to go out to bid in June.
- Treasury report, Anne: Reimbursement still due from DEP for residential rain garden program, due upon submission of final report.
- Historical Commission, Ernie: Planning for the America 250 celebrations includes ongoing discussions about coordinating events with other municipalities, non-profits and T/E schools. Monthly zoom meetings held by Chester County will start June 9 at noon and will take place every second Monday of the month going forward. A British reenactment camp at Teegarden Park is taking shape: volunteers will build their own tents from foraged materials. In conjunction, a walk is planned from Teegarden Park along the Chester Valley trail towards Malvern. The recent Historical Commission neighborhood walk in Berwyn on Saturday, 5/17 attracted about 50 people and was a success. A new non-profit, the Tredyffrin Heritage Center at Duportail House, an education center about Tredyffrin's history is taking shape. The Roughwood Center for Heritage Seeds, currently located on Old Lancaster Rd, is still looking for a new site to relocate. Ideal locations include 1-1.5 acres in a sunny location, and space for refrigeration of the seeds.
- Jenkins Arboretum: Executive director and board members of Jenkins Arboretum reported on their restoration project along a stream at Devon State Rd, which improved stormwater movement at Jenkins and was funded by a grant from PennDOT. The EAC was asked to support naming the currently unnamed stream which is part of Trout Creek tributary. Ideally this name should reflect the historical background of the land and/or its previous inhabitants.
Going forward, an infiltration bioswale on the Jenkins grounds is planned with help from Tredyffrin township and a future grant.

Deer problems at Chesterbrook Parcel 19, Arthur Z: A resident on Painters Lane, Art reported on the persistent problem of deer damage to understory growth. About 50 heritage trees have been counted with no understory left in this parcel. He reported on the more successful deer management at Valley Forge Park and reached out to Chester Valley Deer Management (Ray Clarke). Supervisor Bhaskar reported on successful culling with bow and arrow from an elevated stand in a confined area in his neighborhood on Wisteria Lane. The EAC is in support of culling by licensed hunters in this Chesterbrook neighborhood.

- Despite an updated ordinance on Solid Waste, Chapter 168, adopted by the BOS in the fall of 2024, waste haulers are not following the requirements, which would greatly improve proper recycling and composting of yard waste in the township.
