TREDYFFRIN-EASTTOWN FIRE COMMISSION (TEFC)
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES August 19, 2026, 3:00 PM

Present: Commissioners Eamon Brazunas (Chair), Michael Wacey (Vice Chair), Julie Gosse, Susan LeBoutillier and David Miller; with Dean Dortone from Tredyffrin Township, Don Curley and Jon Ewald from Easttown Township, and Andy Rongaus, Esq. (Solicitor).

1. CALL TO ORDER

The Chair called the meeting to order at 3:00 PM and announced the Commission met in executive session prior to the public meeting at 2:00 PM to review personnel matters.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Chair led the assembly in the Pledge.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Preliminary 2027 Operating and Capital Budget

Calendar Year 2027 (1/1/2027 – 12/31/2027)

September 1, 2026

Introduction to the Preliminary 2027 Budget

Tredyffrin Township and Easttown Township (Townships) receive Fire and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) from the Berwyn, Paoli, and Radnor Fire Companies. These Volunteer Fire Companies (VFCs), staffed by both career and volunteer personnel, work collaboratively to provide high-quality and efficient emergency services to Township residents. In 2025, the VFCs responded to more than 1,500 fire calls and 4,000 EMS calls.

In December 2025, the Townships jointly established the Tredyffrin-Easttown Fire Commission (TEFC) and the Tredyffrin-Easttown Fire Department (TEFD) to coordinate planning and funding for specialized Fire and EMS services. Throughout 2026, TEFC has worked closely with the VFCs to assess Fire and EMS service delivery and prepare for TEFD's future operations. The Townships remain the primary funding source of these services, with a Preliminary 2027 Budget of approximately \$4.1 million.

Over the past eight months, Township staff have collaborated to collect detailed financial information from the Berwyn, Paoli, and Radnor Fire Companies to support financial planning for the 2027 calendar year. This effort has enabled the Townships to anticipate operational needs, plan for future requirements, justify capital investments, and clearly communicate these needs to the Townships Board of Supervisors and the TEFC.

As the transition to the TEFD progresses, careful short- and long-term financial planning is essential to ensure adequate funding for Fire and EMS services in 2027 and beyond. While each VFC maintains its own process for developing and approving annual budgets, the TEFC must submit an approved Final 2027 Budget to the Townships Board of Supervisors by November 15, 2026, outlining VFC contributions for 2027. Funding for routine operating expenses and the phased development of TEFD into a full-time career department will overlap and must be considered within the overall 2027 funding plan from both Townships.

In the coming months, the TEFC will hold two public meetings—on September 16 and October 21—to review the Preliminary 2027 Budget and finalize the 2027 Budget by November 15.

Overview of the Preliminary 2027 Budget

The Townships annual operating budget serves as the primary business plan, outlining the resources required to provide services across all departments and services. It authorizes the expenditures necessary to deliver daily services to Township residents, including public safety, parks, public works, fire and emergency medical services, sanitary sewer, library, and general administration. By law, the Township Board of Supervisors adopt the budget by December 31 for the upcoming calendar year, and it becomes effective on January 1. Funding for the TEFC Final 2027 Budget will be included in the 2027 Adopted Budget for both Townships.

Preliminary 2027 Expenditures

Total VFC contributions for Fire and EMS services in 2027 are projected at \$3,506,000, an increase of \$259,000 (or 8%) over the 2026 Budget. The 2027 increase includes a 4% inflationary adjustment to base funding for Berwyn Fire Company and Paoli Fire Company. Contributions to Radnor Fire Company are projected at \$138,800, which is \$41,600 (or 45%) higher than 2026, reflecting 2025 service levels delivered to Tredyffrin Township. In addition, a \$100,000 contingency expense has been included to support the ongoing transition of Berwyn Fire Company.

New expenditures in the 2027 Budget include TEFD personnel and operating costs totaling \$300,000. The asset transition of 23 Bridge Street and 737–743 Berwyn Avenue will shift associated building maintenance, utilities, and debt service from Berwyn Fire Company to TEFD. Operating costs for the substation at 1485 Valley Forge Road have also been incorporated for allocation between both Townships. Approximately \$140,000 is recommended for an ambulance chassis and Knox Key replacements. The five-year capital plan for 2027–2031 is under review and will be presented prior to adoption of the Final 2027 Budget.

Other Key Budget Considerations:

- Continued analysis of regional Fire and EMS compensation and benefits in 2027
- Execution of the planned transition of Berwyn Fire Company assets and expenditures
- Planning and funding for apparatus replacements scheduled for 2027–2031
- Assessment of EMS equipment replacement needs (heart monitors, AEDs...)
- Submission of Berwyn Fire Company's \$3.1M SAFER grant request to fund eight new full-time Firefighter/EMS positions for three years – if awarded will add new expense in 2027 and beyond

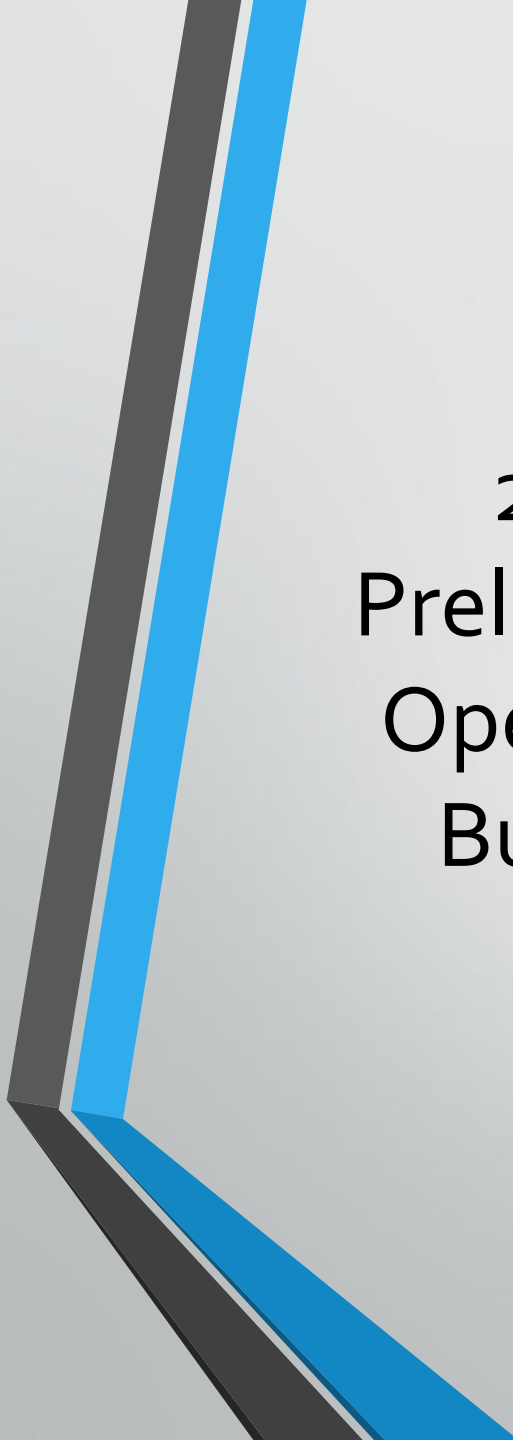

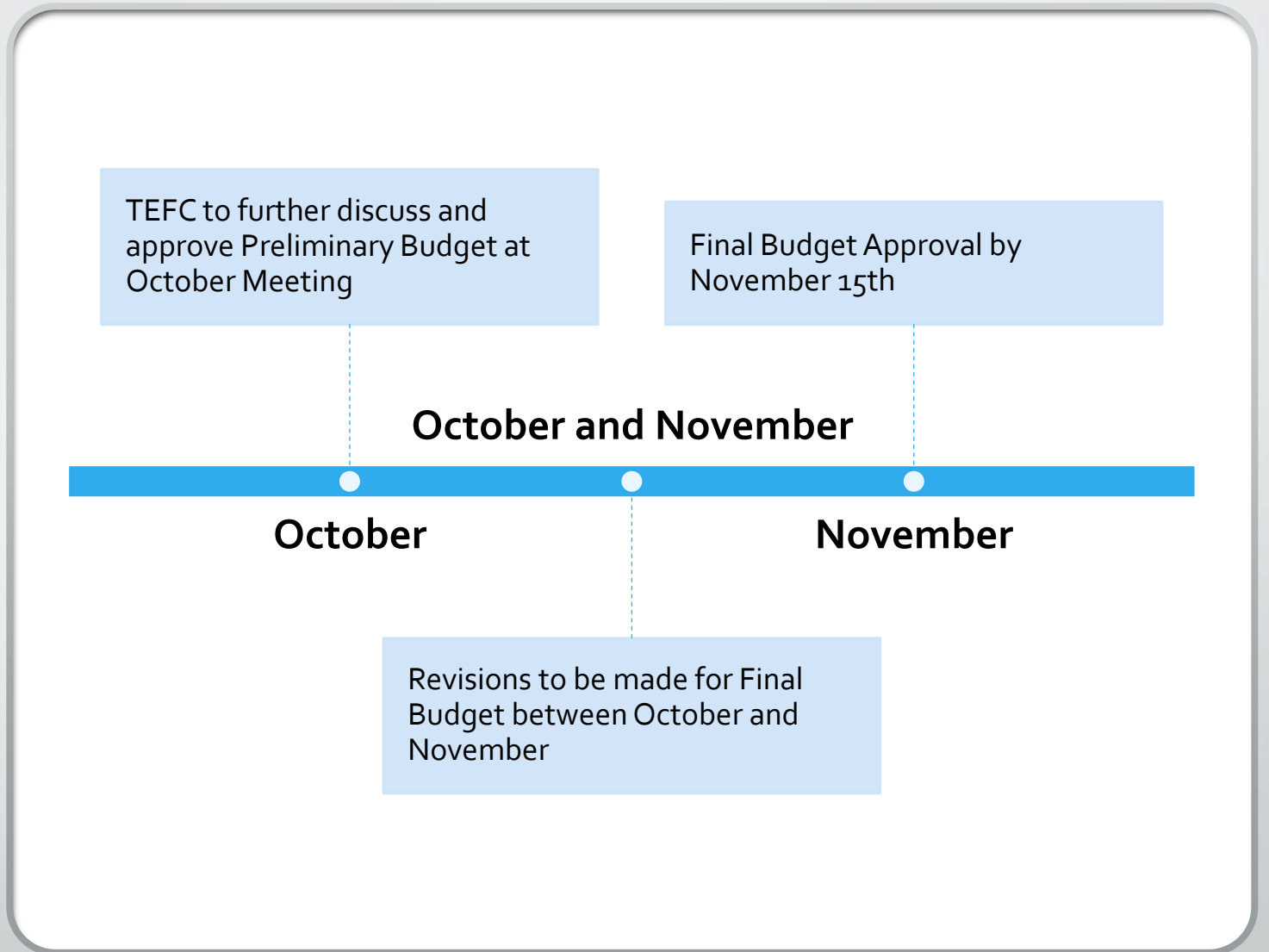

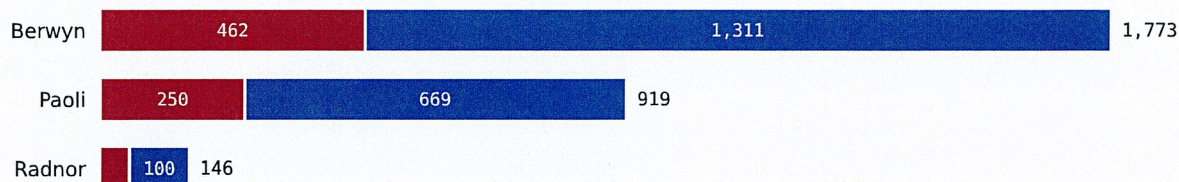

Chart 3. Fire versus EMS mix by department, commission area

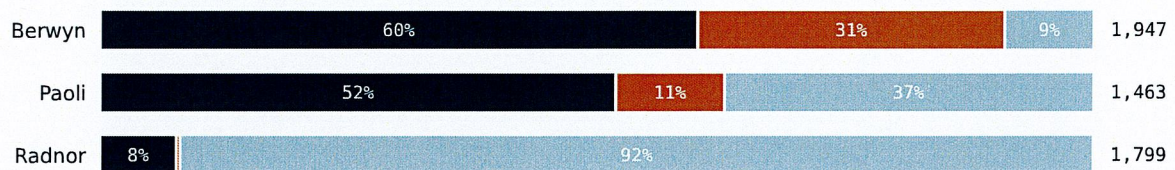

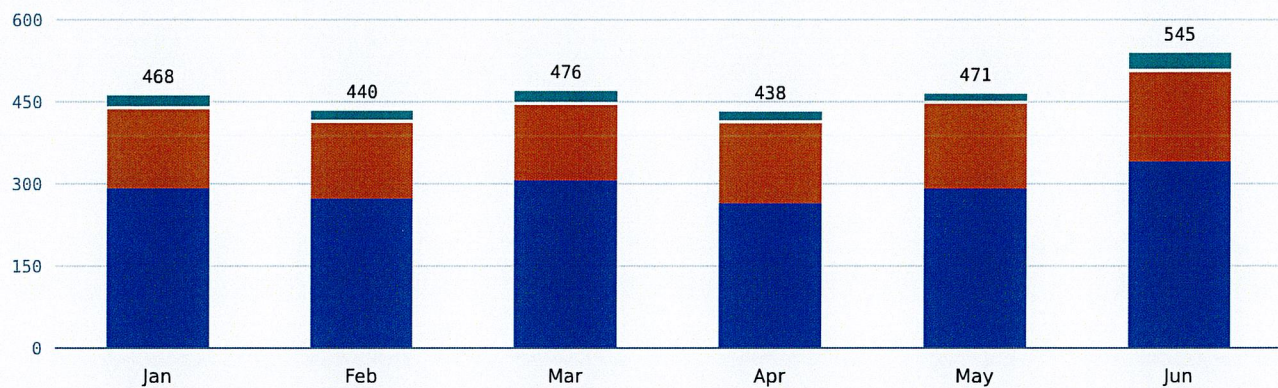

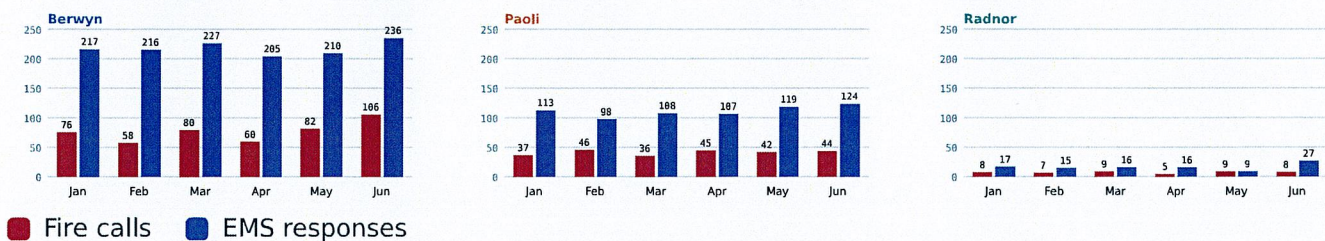


Chart 7. Fire versus EMS by month, commission area only (Tredyffrin + Easttown)

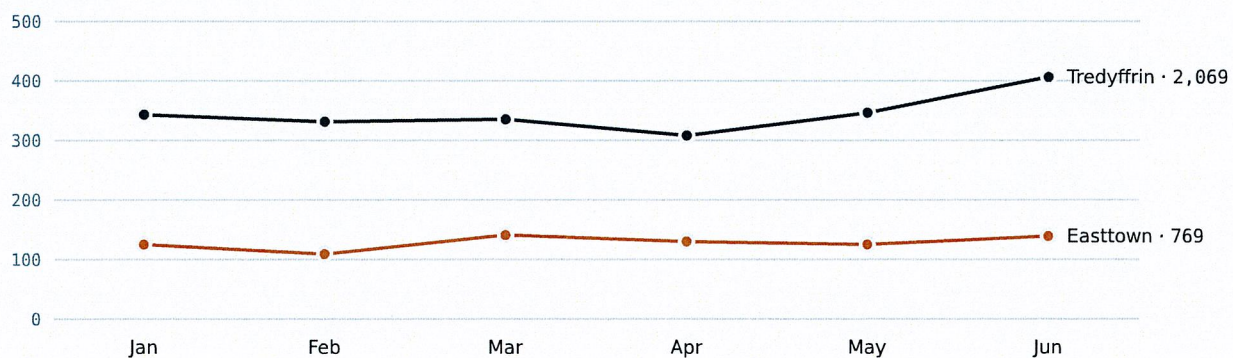

Each call is assigned to the municipality where it occurred. Population figures are the 2020 Census.
